The service of **Tenebrae**, or "Shadows," is one of the oldest of Christian services. It is an extended meditation on the passion of Christ. We enact this service as a progression from light to shadow; as the candles are extinguished, they symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples of Jesus, and his abandonment in death.

Taizé prayer comes out of an ecumenical, international monastic community in France. We hope that these remarks by Brother Roger, the founder of the Taize community, will help you enter more fully into this distinctive form of common prayer. Much of the service will consist of meditative songs: "Singing is one of the most important forms of prayer. A few words sung over and over again reinforce the meditative quality of the prayer. They express a basic reality of faith that can quickly be grasped by the intellect, and that gradually penetrates the heart and the whole being. These simple songs also provide a way of praying when one is alone, during the day or at night, or even in the silence of one's heart while one is working."

Another element of Taizé prayer is silence: "When we try to express communion with God in words, we rapidly reach the end of our capacities. Although God never stops trying to communicate with us, God never wants to impose anything on us. Often God's voice comes in a whisper, in a breath of silence. Remaining in silence in God's presence, open to the Spirit, is already prayer."
