This high holy day of our faith tradition is the culmination of the 40 day Lenten preparation and waiting. Reflection and self-examination give way to jubilation. The practice of pondering our spiritual lives transitions into the celebration of our belovedness in God through Christ.

Here in the northern hemisphere, we have a more tangible sense of the renewing power of God, as winter (finally) gives way to Spring and we can see the renewal and life springing

around us. Flowers and pollinators emerge, ready to fill the earth with new life.



Pastor Paul and I have been using the image of chrysalis and butterfly to set a metaphor for the season; you may have noticed it in worship as a subtle reminder of the progression of the season. For us, it is a powerful symbol of renewal and restoration, particularly in this year when we are celebrating our emergence from the "COVID Cocoon" in which we've been wrapped for three long years. It's also an apt metaphor for Central's celebration of 185 years of ministry and service in Endicott and beyond.

The question Easter poses to each of us is this, I think: What cocoons have held us for too long? What needs to emerge in our own lives? What transformation needs to happen? Where might you fly if you had the wings? What pollination might you be capable of? Whether you have observed a Lenten practice or not, Easter gives all of us a new opportunity to refresh and to breathe in the new life God offers. We invite you to join in the celebration and open up to the possibilities.

May the joy of the Easter season be yours!

PASTOR PAUL'S NOTES

"And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit." (2 Corinthians 3:18, NRSV)

In the original Greek that the author used, the word transformed is "metamorphoo" from which we get the word metamorphosis. Metamorphosis, like a butterfly in a chrysalis, is a dramatic change that something undergoes. These changes are pronounced and radical, but often take time and are gradual.



Sherri and I are doing a major kitchen/dining room/ living room renovation project. We have been planning for well over a year and two big steps have been completed- a supporting wall has been taken down and replaced by a beam and we now have a new kitchen/dining room floor. This change is taking forever and it seems like a never ending task; I don't know if we will ever finish, but when it is done, it will be a great space.

That's kind of what Paul is saying to the church in Corinth– we are being transformed, metamorphosed, into something great, the image of Christ! This transformation is not instantaneous, but it will be radical in the results. We see the glory and greatness of Christ and we are slowly transformed into that same image.

Lent is a time for us to hone our skills and examine our metamorphosis into something greater. How do we assist this transformation to happen in us? Bible study, small discussion groups, reading and responding to devotionals, being in communication with God all help us in becoming the new creations God desires of us.

Mission work is another aspect of our transformation. As we become more and more transformed into the image of Christ, we desire to help and do for others. The Mission Team has several projects that we will be rolling out over the next few months that we can participate in as we reflect the glory and radiance of our Christ.

Today, Sky Lake hosts 20 camps covering a variety of themes, bringing together children, youth and adults with special needs from various cultural, ethnic, and economic backgrounds, allowing them to grow an appreciation of each other in a natural setting and nurturing atmosphere. The Lukens-Jackson Task Force works through the year to raise money and recruit children to send to camp.





One project we will be rolling out soon is Health Kits for UMCOR. These kits contain basic health needs (soap, washcloth, comb, hand towel and a few other items).
