Having celebrated Central's 185th Anniversary with you at Thanksgiving, I am filled with gratitude for each one of you and the blessings we share as a community of faith. And now, as we journey through Advent and approach the joyous season of Christmas, I can feel the holiday frenzy ramping up again. This time of year often pulls us into a whirlwind of shopping, decorating, and festivities that can leave us feeling exhausted rather than uplifted. We are bombarded with messages that suggest the perfect Christmas is found in the latest gadgets, extravagant gifts, and lavish decorations. In the midst of the commercial chaos, the church invites us to rediscover the true meaning of Christmas and find peace in ways that go beyond the material.

Embrace the peace that comes from slowing down and savoring the small, meaningful moments that make this season so special. May this Christmas be a time of spiritual renewal and a rekindling of the peace that surpasses all understanding.


