PASTOR MICHELLE'S NOTES



I have long found a spiritual home in the Christianity of the Celts, a tradition born and flourishing in the islands of northern Europe. It beautifully intertwines the natural world with the divine, emphasizing the interconnectedness of all creation and the presence of God in every aspect of our lives. It invites us to see the sacred in the ordinary, to find the divine in the everyday, and to recognize the thin places where heaven and earth seem to touch. During Lent, in which we have been invited to be intentional about our spiritual practices, the faith of the Celts can offer us a helpful way through the season.

The Celtic idea of *anam cara*, or "soul friend," the notion of seeking spiritual companionship and accountability is deeply helpful. The gift of a community of faith is that we can be soul friends to one another, sharing our burdens and joys as well as our journeys of faith together, in an intertwined practice of prayer, support, and accountability.

The Celtic reverence for nature invites us to take time to appreciate

the beauty of God's creation, to see God's work in the budding flowers, the greening grass, and the changing skies. That appreciation can lead us into a deeper connection with the earth and all that is in it.

The Celtic virtue of simplicity invites us to declutter our lives, not just in terms of food, but also in our consumption, our priorities, and our activities. This season can be a time to clear our hearts and minds, making more room for God's presence and peace.

The Celtic concept of pilgrimage invites us into a pilgrimage of the heart, a time of intentional movement towards a deeper relationship with Christ through an openness to the ways God may lead us to new understandings, new growth, and new depths of love.

Your pastors are walking this Lenten journey with you, as *anam cara,* as support, as persons to pray with and for you. Together, let us journey through this soul-searching and spirit-growing season toward Easter. May this Lenten season be a time of profound transformation and deepening faith for each one of us.

And let's embrace the joy that comes from knowing that we are part of something larger than ourselves—that we are walking this path together, guided by a God who promises new life and resurrection. 

A big **Thank You!** to all who have supported the *Invest in Central* campaign with pledges and giving so far. Without your support we wouldn't have been able to do what we've done. In 2022, the Education Building roof was replaced. In the fall of last year, the rear parking lot was excavated and re-paved and the Nanticoke Avenue glass exterior entrance doors were replaced to improve security and energy efficiency. And we will continue to pursue scheduling and completing the bell tower masonry repair this year.

With \$224,470 committed to date, our Invest in Central Campaign continues to accept pledges and complete the priority projects. These projects will consume approximately \$201,000 of the currently committed \$224,470. The remaining balance and any additional commitments will be used for our next priority, stained glass window preservation and protection. Again, *Thanks to all* for your contributions to date. 
