### ALLOCATIONS TEAM REPORT

Allocations had a busy Fall grant season! We were able to facilitate Central UMC giving away nearly \$5000 this cycle. The whole year in total: \$13,685! Thank you to all the organizations who applied, and for their work in the community. Here's the breakdown for the Fall grant season:

Central UMC Blood Drive: \$120 grant Community of Grace of the Southern Tier:

\$900 grant to support a welcome home brunch for formerly incarcerated women

Church in the Wild: \$1200 to help purchase equipment

Women's Club of Endicott: \$865 for a new shed to organize donations for Blessing Boxes

Central UMC Missions Team: \$600 to start a bike ministry

American Civic Association: \$1200 to support relocating refugees

### TECH MINISTRY

TV Ministry continues to go well. Adaptable equipment allows the Tech Team to provide more varied and more interesting experiences for viewers While they also result in more opportunities for glitches and snags, the presence of consistent personnel in the booth have lead to a team able to identify and fix problems so that they have little or no effect on either worshipers in the sanctuary or those participating remotely.

We have made progress on ways to involve remote and on-site worshipers together in real time. We hope to roll this feature out before the end of the calendar year.

The Youth/Young Adult Intern Program continues to enrich the knowledge and capabilities of the young people in it, while also attracting new youth. Some of the older youth who have been with the program for a period of time now serve as teachers and mentors to new team members. They have risen to occasion well. It is an exciting step.

A number of on-site and remote adults support TV Ministry's work, too. They offer their gifts and graces not only in operating the equipment, but also in shepherding the Interns, keeping equipment in good working order, and in post-editing for the twice-weekly Spectrum cable broadcasts.

One area that needs to be shored up is persons to gather and collate the weekly materials the tech booth members need to quickly and smoothly move through the service. Right now, I am the only person practiced in preparing them. This makes it difficult for the booth personnel when I am absent because of illness or travel.

These preparations require no technical knowledge and can be done from home with only a computer and standard software. Contact me at the booth on Sundays or through the office to find out more.

## CENTRAL'S 185<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATES 55 YEARS OF HANDBELL MUSIC MINISTRY 1968-2023

"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord" Psalm 100:1

Central's handbell program was initiated by Rev. Bradley Havens in 1968. Three octaves of Schulmerich handbells were purchased by using Memorial Funds and were dedicated into service on 5/19/68, Under the direction of Miriam Hill, two youth choirs were formed, one junior high and one senior high. During the first year, the senior high choir performed in 13 CUMC services, 3 services at other area churches, 7 community performances and hosted the area's firs combined handbell concert with 3 other churches.

Directors and ringers changed over time. In 1985 the bells rang at Easter service for the first time in several years under the direction of Audry Byer, Vestal H.S. Band Director. Denise Johnson then began directing the group of adults that later became known as the Cappella Ringers. In 1988, Carol Coughenour was hired as the Director of Music/Chancel Choir Director. Having an extensive background in handbell directing, Carol developed the Century Ringers and Meri Ringers youth choirs and accomplished fundraising for the full 5 octave set of bells and 3 octaves of Malmark choirchimes. The Centry Ringers became an accomplished audition choir that toured and performed in many churches, community settings and participated in competitions, including Disney World.

Today, the Cappella Ringers continue to offer their music ministry with the purpose of "making a joyful noise" for worshippers at Central Church. We rejoice in the support that has been provided for the handbell program and celebrate the 11 directors and approximate 275 ringers who have served in the program during the past 55 years. We invite others to join us and see for yourself how enjoyable ringing handbells can be!

### COLLEGE & MILITARY CARDS


