### COUNCIL AND MINISTRY AREAS RESTRUCTURE IS HERE!

At the September 26, 2023 Church Council meeting, a motion was made, seconded and unanimously passed to restructure the way we do administrative and programmatic work here at Central UMC. It will go into effect in October.

For many years Central's leadership has been comprised of Program Councils to work on ministry objectives, administrative committees to steward the financial, people, and building resources, and a large church council made up of representatives from all these areas as well as at-large members nominated from the congregation. These groups met variously on all four Tuesdays and one Thursday of each month. This system served us very well for a very long time, but it has become clear for many reasons that it is time to make an adjustment.

Your Pastors presented a motion that would create one meeting night per month, ensure that the essential work of ministry and administration are accomplished, and consolidate the program councils and some committees into the Church Council. We will be in conversation with these groups individually to offer further detail.

What it looks like: A Ministry Night would be scheduled for the fourth Tuesday of each month. At 5:30pm, the Finance Council, Trustees, SPRC (alternate months), and Education Council will meet in separate spaces. Allocations, Lukens-Jackson Camping Committee, Van Committee, UWF and UMM will continue to meet on their own schedules, or may use this time as well. At 6.30, those groups plus the rest of the Church Council members will gather for food and fellowship. At 7:00, those committees are dismissed, except for the Chairs of all the abovementioned groups, who will continue into the Church Council meeting.

Along with these Chairs, the Council will include persons with passion for the areas being consolidated, including Missions, Fellowship, Worship. The goal is to create ministry together as a body, with an eye to including these three identified purposes into every project, ministry, or service we take on; in other words, ministries will be developed and coordinated by the Council as a whole. The work of making ministry happen will be undertaken by action groups from within and outside the Council serving ad hoc to accomplish the ministries developed by the Council.

This adjustment is designed to accomplish these goals: Streamline decision making, eliminate extra meetings, make space for creative ministry planning and to surface new ideas, and offer a different way to participate in leadership with high engagement and low time commitment.

Moving forward, this means that there will be no Program Councils on October 3, and Central's first Ministry Night will begin at 5.30pm on Tuesday, October 24!

# CONTRIBUTIONS FROM IRA

Reminder that for those over 70 1/2 they can make a tax free donation directly to Central from their IRA. This is called a Qualified Charitable Contribution (QCD). The donations must be made directly from the IRA to the Central and reported by the IRA trustee on Form 1099-R. For those over 73 who are required to make a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), from their IRA direct contributions to Central are also tax free donations.

### SHEPHERD'S SUPPER UPDATE

Shepherd's Supper continues to serve a record number of meals each Thursday. Through August we have served 6,515 meals vs 5,032 in 2022. That's an increase of nearly 30%. We have also seen the number of nights where we have served over 200 meals increase dramatically. In 2022 we had two nights over 200 meals served by the end of August. This year we've had 12 nights with 200 + meals served; we had 4 weeks in August alone with over 200 meals served! This is all possible because we have very dedicated and committed teams to cook and serve each week. While we do receive food from the Broome Bounty for free and from the Food Bank at a reduced cost, the increase in number of meals served has put a drain on our financial resources. We have some who donate to Shepherd's Supper on a regular basis, and for that we are thankful. However, with this increased need we will need more support. Please consider financially supporting this very important part of Central's outreach to the community. With your donation just indicate it's for Shepherd's Supper.






#### **SOCK-TOBER**


