

"Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10)





DID YOU KNOW?

Early gatherings of our church were in homes, a schoolhouse and other local buildings. The first church building was built around 1848 and stood on the corner of Union Street and Liberty Ave. The cost was \$1,100. Between 1871-1872 a new church building was built on the corner of Nanticoke and Union Street at a cost of \$12,090. It faced Union Street not Naticoke Ave. It had a tall spire but because of lightning strikes, had to be lowered. A bell tower was then added in 1885. The original bell continues to call us to worship. When our present sanctuary was built in 1927, the old church was turned and attached to the rear of the church.



INVEST IN CENTRAL UPDATE

By now you've all heard of Central's plan to raise capital funds to do some much needed repairs and upkeep to the church property and building. Financial commitments to this campaign have taken a few steps - first by the campaign committee, then by the Church Leadership, then through a few in person presentations where the details of what's being done and why. The last step has been a mailing to all members asking for a 5 year commitment to financially support these much needed improvements.

The good news is that through this effort and the generosity of many of you - \$198,270 has been committed over 5 years, this from only 38 givers. and we have also received donations of nearly \$85,000. With the recent mailing, we are expecting more commitments bringing us closer to our goal of \$450,000. We will continue reporting our progress to reaching this goal Central has been serving God, serving our neighbors and loving all for 185 years, with this continued support we will be serving well into the future.



FINANCE UPDATE

We have good news and hopefully that will continue! The good news is that Central's finances are in very good shape going into the summer season. In year's past we've had to use Endowment funds to pay our expenses as we enter summer. But this year through good stewardship and generous giving of the Central Congregation, we enter the summer with a positive balance.

Hopefully we all continue to support Central through the summer. Typically giving drops off during July and August as we have vacations and travel. We are hopeful that the strong financial commitment continues through the summer.
