I don't know if I would consider myself a 'tree-hugger,' but there is something about leaning up against a beautiful maple or oak, or perhaps a mighty pine tree, when life is a bit in chaos, and breathing in the fragrance of life, taking strength from the solidity of the tree's trunk. "Summer afternoon—summer afternoon; to me those have always been the two most beautiful words in the English language." (Henry James)

We are well into the hot, lazy days of summer. As a kid, I would be outside all the time with the neighborhood kids—playing in the dirt pile, running through the woods, camping, going on adventures, and generally raising mayhem. Now, in my "adult years", I tend to use my days gardening, doing barn work, reading, hiking, camping, going on adventures, and generally raising mayhem. Not too much has changed—but summer brings me more hours to do all of that in!

I have trouble being still; I have trouble listening; I have trouble knowing; I have trouble being calm. One of the spiritual disciplines is solitude— the idea of taking time away from the "busy-ness" of life and spending time with God- alone. It is easy for me to tell my people this, but I sometimes don't practice what I preach! It is time for me to practice this!

During July and August, I have committed myself to exploring more about me and who I am and what my relationship with God is; I still sometimes struggle with my relationship with God. To assist me with this commitment, I have decided to set aside at least half an hour each afternoon (at least 5 days a week) to sit in the same place in the woods next to our home and just be. My goal- listen and feel the presence of the Holy Spirit. I am reminded of Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God." I may or may not journal so some days may include writing, some days may include drawing or painting, some days may include doodles or thoughts that I have, but my hope is that most days will be just quiet solitude with God. I feel most connected with God in the woods, so I am hoping this will help.

My summer challenge for you- "Be still." Can you do it?





July 15-August 4: The Character of a Methodist & the New Social Principles


